The purpose of the programme

The aim of the programme is to provide aspiring musical artists with the essential skills to be able to create music. This is through development of the skills and conceptual knowledge needed by emersion in a range of music genres, to enable the learners to contribute to their community, to commercial projects, and to prepare for higher level study.

Graduates of this programme will be able to:

- Apply technical skills to create music across a range of genres
- Apply knowledge of musical genres to create music
- Apply creative processes to produce and perform music and enhance own practice

4.0

MUSICIAN'S TOOLKIT

This course is an intensive 4-week course designed to ignite your passion for music while building a solid foundation in essential skills for creative work in music.

4.1

GENRE EXPLORATION 1

This 4-week course builds on the foundational skills developed in 4.0, focusing on a dive into a specific musical genre. Students will explore the technical, creative, and cultural aspects of a chosen genre, developing proficiency in relevant technologies and creative processes. The course emphasises practical application, creative problem-solving, and critical reflection.

4.2

GEN EX II

This 4-week course builds on the foundational skills developed in 4.1, expanding students' experience through the exploration of a second specified genre. Participants will delve into the technical, creative, and cultural dimensions of their chosen genre, fostering proficiency in the relevant technologies and creative processes. The course emphasises practical application, innovative problem-solving, and critical reflection, encouraging students to engage deeply with the unique characteristics and influences of the genre.

4.3

GEN EX III

This 4-week course builds upon the skills acquired in 4.2, focusing on the exploration of a third (and final) specified genre. Students will investigate the technical, creative, and cultural elements of this genre, enhancing their proficiency in associated technologies and creative methodologies. The course prioritises practical application, inventive problem-solving, and critical analysis, encouraging students to examine the distinctive features and contextual significance of the genre, thereby enriching their overall musical understanding and versatility.

PROGRAMME SPECIFIC INFORMATION

Courses are run as block courses with attendance required on Tuesdays – Thursday.

This programme is not yet approved for loans and allowances and is not supported by government funding.

Topics you will learn:

- Hands-on instrument lessons/band rehearsals
- Performance workshop(s)
- Industry standard Digital Audio Workstations (DAW) techniques and sound design
- Chart writing and arranging

- Live performance

All courses are assessed by competency assessment, performance practical and music technology project.

There will be a performance open to the community at the end of the programme, and the possibility of a tour around Auckland High Schools.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry Criteria for this programme is:

- Students will be 16 years or age or older
- Domestic student
- NCEA Level 1 or equivalent
- All will be required to attend an interview/audition. Some musical proficiency is required (pitch, time).
- Where English is not the first language IELTS General of Academic score of 5.5 with no band score lower than 5 or equivalent

PATHWAYS AND FURTHER STUDY OPTIONS

This qualification is intended to provide a pathway to further education rather than employment.

Graduates of this qualification may be employed in junior assistant and/or support roles in related creative industries and/or in community based or self-employed creative enterprises.
